ISKR was established in 2009. As of August 2018, our total number of students is 225.

Advanced Placement & AP Capstone Diploma

Beginning in 2016-2017, ISKR began offering the **AP Capstone Diploma**. The AP Capstone Diploma is an honor conferred to "curious, independent, collaborative scholars" who successfully complete two externally-examined rigorous research courses and at least four other discipline-specific AP courses.

Academic Program

The ISKR High School program provides a well-rounded university preparatory education and equips students in Grade 9 - 12 with critical thinking, communication and research skills as well as in-depth knowledge.

The curriculum centers on five core subjects – English, Mathematics, Science, Social Sciences and a World Language (French & Spanish). Additionally, students choose from a variety of electives including a second World Language, Visual & Performing Arts, Computer Science, Photography, Rwandan Studies, Film Analysis, Sociology, Physical Education, and more.

Students are given the flexibility to choose advanced course work in areas of interest to them. The curriculum in grades 9 and 10 is designed as a bridge toward the rigor of Advanced Placement.

Graduation Requirements

ISKR diploma recipients must earn at least 28 credits. Graduates must have taken at least one AP course and must be enrolled in at least three core courses every year. Students who transfer after grade 9 follow an individual graduation plan which is approved by the administration.

In addition, graduates must design and execute Service Learning projects each year of high school.
